2020/2021 EMAA Head Start Self-Assessment/Improvement Plan

In accordance with the Head Start Performance Standards 1304.51(i)(1), the East Missouri Action Agency, Head Start conducted a self-assessment of their program. Following is a summary of our key strengths and accomplishments as well as the results from our assessment.
